## **Brand Evolution**

As a prominent representation of the organization, the new logo is optimistic, forward-moving, and smart. Inspired by the convergence of three key critical success factors, represented by green, red, and yellow arrows, the forms meet to create a bold blue arrow signifying sustainable success.

The fresh colours speak to the diversity and richness in programming and services, which all work together to move clients forward.





• **Green:** Acknowledges the Innovation Cluster's history and represents business acceleration programs.

• **Red:** Represents mentoring and advising, critical to realizing measurable results.

• Yellow: Represents the skill and knowledge-building programming essential to sustained growth.

• **Blue:** The green, red, and yellow arrows merge to acknowledge that all are critical to igniting sustainable forward momentum and long-term success.

#### **Serving Small and Medium Enterprises**

Since its founding, the organization has focused mainly on serving ideation-stage founders. In 2023, the Innovation Cluster's Board of Directors established a new vision with its three-year strategic plan. In 2024, the team reevaluated its market focus in light of evolving local, regional, and national trends.

Technology-based SMEs are a growing underserved market, often moving to larger Canadian metropolitan areas to access the skill-building, ecosystems, and support necessary for scaling their businesses and accessing crucial resources and funding.

SME companies represent Canada's growth engine, generating two-thirds of new jobs and investing more in their operations than their ideation and mature counterparts. The challenges SMEs seek to overcome align directly with the Innovation Cluster's core offerings, particularly programs, ecosystems, and advisors that facilitate access and talent retention, competitive and risk management, technological and digital innovation, and funding.

Expanding the Innovation Cluster's programming to support Peterborough, the Kawarthas, and the broader region's SMEs will enable these technology ventures to grow, create jobs, and thrive while establishing the region as a centre of innovation and growth in Canada.

The Innovation Cluster is also announcing the launch of new digital-first programming in three areas – skill & knowledge building, mentoring & advising, and business acceleration. The three programming areas are designed to complement and reinforce each other to maximize client and participant impact and benefits.

- Mentoring & Advising Expanded Experts-in-Residence and Business Advisor roster, including new serial entrepreneurs, vertical industry experts, and investors.
- **Business Accelerator Programming** New accelerator programs for specific company growth stages as a complement to current LevelUp and StartUp Visa programs.

New dynamic programming supports entrepreneurs as they progress through their commercialization, scaling, rapid growth, maturity, and innovation stages.
